
2017-19 State Budget SNSP Related Provisions

Voucher Amount

Due to a veto by Governor Walker, the per pupil aid increase that affects the 2018-19 SNSP voucher amount is still being calculated by the Legislative Fiscal Bureau. SCW will notify schools as soon as the amount is finalized.

SNSP

- Remove the open enrollment denial requirement.
- Eliminate the prior year public school attendance requirement.
- Provide for SNSP summer school funding as of 2018.
- Beginning in 2018-19, a school can spend up to 150% of the voucher amount if it submits a financial statement to DPI listing the costs. This level of funding would be deducted from the student's resident district the following year (i.e. higher funding would lag one year).
- If a school spends over 150% of the voucher amount, the school would be reimbursed at a 90% rate by a state-funded high-cost special need appropriation.
- Schools can also choose to maintain the current voucher amount, without making high cost adjustments.

Summer School (effective summer 2018)

- For students who attend at least 15 days of summer school, the summer voucher payment is equal to 5 percent of the student's prior year voucher amount. Students no longer need to attend 15 days in order to generate summer school payments; students who attend fewer days will have their payment equal to 5 percent of the student's prior year voucher amount multiplied by the number of days the student attended summer school divided by 15.
